UVCA **CRIME ALERT!**

It has been reported, through various social media that the View is being targeted by criminals. Police Chief Jones is aware of this activity and notes that it is not limited to just the View. In regular discussions with neighboring police departments, such as Upper Arlington, Grandview and 5th by Northwest, they too are reporting the same activity. However, they seem to be getting more bold. Just within the last week at least one car was stolen, despite being locked. It cannot be said enough. **LOCK** your car doors. Make sure your car is **EMPTY** of any valuable—including loose change. Anything visible that would give a would-be criminal the desire to break into your car. Make sure you lock and secure your doors and windows, especially on the first floor as criminals have been known to come through an open first floor window to rob a house. Turn on exterior lights if you have them. **BE OBSERVANT**. Watch out for your neighbors property. **If you see suspicious activity report it to the police (614-471-5720 or 911)**, and let your neighbors know. **If you haven't joined the UVCA Block Watch, please contact Carol Stewart** and she will get you in touch with your Street Captain.

View of the Past with Wayne

Wayne has lived in the View for almost 20 years. His grandparents, Fred and Betty Persinger originally moved in to University View in 1957. His mother, Eileen was a senior at Ohio State University and lived at home while completing her studies. Once school was completed she met and married her husband Larry. Together they raised their two sons in Upper Arlington. Even though it was a different neighborhood, they were never far from the View for very long.



On football Saturday's Wayne and his brother would be dropped off at the grandparents. His parents would go to the games, and get dropped off at the Lennox Factory. (Now Lennox Shopping Center). They would listen to the games on the radio while they raked leaves. Grandma would either make chili or spaghetti for everyone after the game. They would gather around the TV with their dinner trays and watch Lawrence Welk and Hee-Haw.

Wayne also got to know his grandparents neighbors. Louise was a favorite as she kept bees and would give the kids honeycombs. She also had a garden in the ample back yard, as did his grandparents...along with growing peanuts they also raised rabbits. The Kings, who lived down the street, were always welcoming and enjoyed visits from the neighbor's children and always had a treat of some sort.

At Christmas time, his family would come over to help decorate for Christmas and his grandma would cook dinner for everyone. In fact, most every holiday was spent with family here in the View. The rest of the year they would have sleepovers and play around the neighborhood. Wayne and the other neighbor kids would usually be found playing in the creek out front of Chambers Circle or at the playground.

While in college, Wayne lived in The Chambers, the apartments off of Chambers Road. After school, it would not be too long before he found the View calling back to him. Once his grandparents had both passed he moved into their house in 1998. With so many warm memories of family and celebrations it was a no-brainer. Wayne wanted to keep the house in the family and live in the View as a full-time resident. In 2006 he completely remodeled the house and couldn't imagine living anywhere else. "What's not to love? It's a great little community, where people know each other and work hard to create a friendly neighborhood environment. Not to mention we are close to everything — you can't beat the location!"

New Dining and Entertainment Coming Soon! Two new dining and entertainment venues are coming to the Lennox & Grandview areas.

High Bank Distillery, coming to Grandview in 2018 will be a distillery, tasting room and restaurant. They will be leasing space that used to be Goodale Pro Hardware, at 1051 Goodale Blvd. "Grandview is a great area. It's vibrant. There's a lot of millennials there. It's a very active community," the owner said. The majority of the facility will be used for the bar, restaurant, kitchen and bathrooms. A bar-slash-arcade area and patio will host shuffleboard, air hockey and foosball games. Upon opening, High Bank Distillery will offer an organic gin, an organic vodka, and a blended rye whiskey.

CoreLife Eatery, the Syracuse-based restaurant chain that launched last November near Polaris Fashion Place announced plans to open locations at The Lennox Town Center and inside a new building currently under construction at Lane and High. "A lot of our locations are in power centers with high traffic and high visibility, but also with close proximity to college campuses," said CoreLife spokesperson Stephen Donnelly. "There are a lot of students that adhere to an active lifestyle, but really, our food is for everyone who wants a fast casual option where they can get a healthy, clean alternative that's good for you." Both locations near OSU are expected to open in early 2018.



Neighbors at the last UVCA meeting overwhelmingly supported the idea of building and caring for **little library houses** at both **Triangle Park** and the **playground**.
